# **President – Russell Blair**

Despite all that I am still finding some that have some potential for this fall. Seems like every day I am moving some birds around and putting just a few more into conditioning pens. I am preparing for a pretty hectic show season, and it appears I will be at a show every weekend starting September 28 through the first weekend of November, Lord willing of course. Speaking of upcoming shows, in case you missed the announcement on our forum, our board of directors has voted to allocate \$1,120.00 worth of cash awards for each

National Meet. So be sure to put the Celebrating Ameraucana in Dairyland National Meet September 28<sup>th</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> in Portage Wisconsin and Hog Wild for Ameraucana National Meet November 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> on your calendars. For more information on the upcoming meets be sure to go to our website and take a look.

I would like to thank all our members that generously took an ad in our 2024 Ameraucana Handbook. We had six full page ads, 9 half page ads, and 2 quarter page ads taken out by our members. If all goes well, I am hoping to have it printed off by the time you receive this quarterly newsletter. Being the first time I have ever done something like this I want to make sure to get it right, so I am diligently working on it in all my free time. So please check in to our forum for any updates and announcements concerning its printing.

Since this is an election year, I would also like to remind all our members that all nominations for an elected officer position must be turned in to me by October 1, 2024. All our elected positions are open for nominations. You can go to our website at ameraucana.org and look at the qualifications and expectations of all the officers in our by-laws which are located under the constitution tab. Once I receive all the nominations, I will then appoint a director to send out the Ballots on October 15, 2024. Remember all Ballots must be received by the election commissioner, Max Strawn, by November 1, 2024, who will tally the votes and forward the ballots to the assistant commissioner Jeff Vance. Jeff Vance will then forward the final tally of votes to the board of directors, and we will announce the new officers who will assume office on January 1, 2025.

One last thing I would like to mention. Becky Pelton asked me to approach the board of directors to officially pledge our support in her attempt to get the Ermine project variety recognized. I am pleased to announce with a majority of Yes votes the board has agreed to help her in the process. So, if you would like to help be sure to look for announcements and updates concerning their efforts on our forum. I would also like to let all our members know I am trying to get enough splash Bantams entered at the Portage Wisconsin show to meet the pre-qualifier numbers. That means we will need 4 cocks, 4 hens, 4 cockerels, and 4 pullets of splash bantams entered to have the judge fill out an affidavit. Once I

get past the printing of the Ameraucana Handbook I will be focusing on beginning the process of petitioning to get the splash bantam recognized by the APA. So, if you breed or own any splash Bantams, please try to make it to the Wisconsin International Poultry Show in Portage Wisconsin September 28th and 29th.

Well, I think I about covered all that I should for this newsletter and since my to do list is continually growing, I will bid you all a farewell. Remember to check into our forum in between newsletter publishing's for all the up-to-date changes and news concerning our Ameraucana Alliance and Ameraucana. Good luck getting your birds in prime condition and may you all be blessed with a trip onto champion row. Who knows, I might just be there to shake your hand and congratulate you.

### **Director - Jeff Sonsalla**





## **Director - Michael Muenks**



Greetings from the northern edge of the Ozarks in central Missouri. As I write this a stretch of delightful August temperatures in the 70s is ending with the return of the normal subtropical heat and humidity summer in Missouri. I have been diligently culling older birds and young grow outs to get to the best birds to keep for next year and to share out this fall.

The other side project related to the Ameraucana Alliance has been helping members design ads for the 2024 update to the Ameraucana Handbook that you may have read about in an email from Russ and on the forum. It has been fun to be creative while taking refuge from the summer heat.

I have been thrilled with the work that has been happening to create bantam ermine Ameraucana. It will be neat to see them launch as soon as the size

issue is stable. I have not attempted a sibling mating, instead I have been taking the smallest tweener ermine males to black bantam females with great type and conformation. A lot of tiny tots have hatched and about half are the appropriate bantam size. I have kept none of the black offspring from the project. I plan to donate a few for the silent auctions at both Celebrating Ameraucana in the Dairyland in Wisconsin and Hog Wild for Ameraucana in Arkansas.

My focus this year beyond the ermine project was on the rare varieties of bantam Ameraucana such as buff, brown red, and silver. I've hatched almost every egg laid. A few nice offspring and I'm still hatching every egg laid in the hopes of having enough to replace most of my aging stock. I realized that having taken a year off from hatching a couple of years ago really put me in a bad place when it comes to the age of the birds I have now and declining fertility.

The other major focus was on brown red and silver large fowl Ameraucana in addition to the ermine project large fowl. It has been a mixed bag of results. I will not even go into the dismal brown red large fowl results this season other than to say I will be reaching out to Stacy Melton once again. Silver large fowl have been a mixed bag with some positive results. I have always given the advice to people new to the breed to not cross lines of a variety because unexpected things show up. While I knew deep down that unexpected things would show up when I crossed two lines of Silver Ameraucana, I did not expect that 75% of the offspring would be culls – mostly black heads/necks and unrecognizable as a silver. At first, I thought they would grow out of it because

based on chick down they looked good, but sadly they did not. I'm glad that I only shared eggs with one fellow breeder, because the results of crossing the lines was terrible. I am going to take care of that fellow breeder and share half of the good ones that I got, but seriously, be ready for what happens when one crosses different, unrelated lines of a variety.

A very recent development here at Bantam Hill has been the news that my poultry feed that I have sung the praises of to too many members of the club, which was a formulation developed by Jeff Mattocks of the Fertrell Company and made by Kraut Creek of Greenville, Ohio, has been discontinued. For several years I have purchased the feed by the ton and had it shipped from Greenville, OH to California, MO. To say I am devastated is accurate and I am pouring over different feed mixes, formulations, and suppliers to find something that is acceptable to me.

I am serving as the chair of the "Celebrating Ameraucana in Dairyland" at the Wisconsin International Poultry Show in Portage, Wisconsin September 28-29, 2024, meet committee. 

#### Laurie Ashley's battle with cancer

#### An update on the Ermine Ameraucana variety from Becky Pelton

The first copy of all requested information to begin the process of getting the variety added to the APA standard was sent in on June 1st, 2024. Shortly after that the struggle began. Due to the submission process I had to Submit a complete long version of the SOP along with a shortened version. They must be identical in wording. The shorter version will be printed in the APA book while the longer version is just for their eyes. So, I went back to the drawing board, gathered my crew of long-time breeders and all the mistakes were fixed and resubmitted on August 4th, 2024. Next issue that came up was the name . . . . Because the name Erminette was a variety and was retired in 1980's it would have to be taken out of retirement and we would have to breed to meet the standard. Our birds closely resemble the retired SOP but not exactly. The name Ermine was a breed name that was also retired in 1980's. The same thing would have had to be done with this name. It is not easy to take a name out of retirement. It can take up to 2 years to do that and then it could take several more years to have the wording changed in either of the current SOPs to meet our breed standards. After speaking with the APA Standard Committee and then speaking with my group of expert Ameracauna breeders we decided it would be easier to change the name than take one of the current SOP's out of retirement. We have several names that have been repeatedly suggested so if the APA Standard Committee turns down the name that I just submitted then I am going to do a survey on new name. I am hoping that the Standard Committee will accept the name "Royal Ermine" that I submitted. That way we can keep the name that we have all come to know and love but still change it enough to be different from either of the existing names. The last issue we are currently dealing with is our 1st and 2nd pre-qualifying meet. When first reading all in the information on "How to submit a New Breed or

Variety" myself along with MANY others that are helping with this endeavor understood that there was no time restrictions on when those 2 meets needed to be held. After submitting everything I was told there needed to be at least 365 days between the 2 pre-qualifying. So, our second meet that was held in Sedelia, MO would not be accepted. So now our band of Ermine breeders are struggling to find our next pre-qualifying meet. Working with the APA is going to be difficult but with patience we will endure the challenges we are all facing. This is a group effort, and I have tried to be sure as many that choose to be involved has been able to reach out to myself or any other breeder that breeds this beautiful and unique Ameracauna variety. Don't get discouraged, we are going to get this done. If we do have to change the name, it's going to be fine. It's going to allow us to move past some of the stigmas that the name Ermine or Erminette has found recently. Please continue to work towards the goals we have set for ourselves and our birds. Proposed Ermine Ameraucana Variety Description Large Fowl

COLOR - MALE AND FEMALE

COMB, FACE, WATTLES AND EAR-LOBES: Red, except female earlobes to be very pale, matching color of the skin. BEAK: Horn to black, with dark markings allowable on the horn color.

EYES: Reddish bay

PLUMAGE: Primarily white feathers with fewer, preferably solid black feathers. FLUFF: Primarily white to sooty white fluff, with fewer less defined dull black fluff.

SHANKS AND TOES: Slate, bottoms of feet and toes are white.

NOTE: Feather distribution should be predominantly white with black feathers. Black feathers should be evenly distributed throughout the entire body. This pattern should be clear and defined. An occasional black feather with white ticking or black feather with mottling may appear. The beard and muffs will often be completely white, which is acceptable due to the random distribution of single black feathers across the entire bird. Smokey colored feathers are to be discouraged but not a disqualification.

DISQUALIFICATIONS: Any appearance of rust or straw in plumage. More than 50% black feathers in the plumage.
