Last December, the Ameraucana Club of Turkey had a meet at a show in eastern Turkey. Our Alliance board of directors voted to donate rosettes to the winners of the show with Champion and Reserve Champion Ameraucanas. Our member Mehmet Özgen is President of the Ameraucana Club of Turkey. They, in return, sent a





With the major rewrite of our Constitution, all language about our national meet was taken out and left for our Board of Directors to address with club policies. Just after the first of the year, I posted proposed changes to our Meet Policy on our Ameraucana Forum for member comments, prior to the board addressing it. Please share your thoughts about club matters like this on our forum. Newsletters come out quarterly, but if you have internet access, our forum can keep you up to date daily.


Our Ameraucana Website has been revamped with a completely new look. All the old content is still there, along with some new stuff. When you click on a menu tab, there is often another that appears. So, if at first you don't see what you are looking for, click around and you'll find more. The Exhibitor Points tab is under the Meets tab and the Archives tab is under the Download tab. I've tried to keep those most closely related to each other, together. However, the layout may change. Under the Board of Directors tab, you'll find full bios of each board member.

It's that time of year again to take out club page ads in the ABA & APA yearbooks. If Alliance members pay for six (6) 1 7/8" high by 2 3/16" wide ads, the top quarter page is FREE for our club ad in the ABA yearbook and very similar for the APA. It is \$240 for a color page or \$40/ ABA ad. I just need your ad info, a high resolution logo, photo, etc. (if you have one) and payment. For every 6 ads sold we'll take one page and last year we had a club page in each yearbook. If you pay to pay@AmeraucanaAlliance.org, using PayPal, please consider adding a couple bucks to cover the PayPal fee. You don't have to stick with just one ad per page...you may take one to all six of them. The Deadline is April 1st for me to have the ads and payments by, so please have everything to me by March 20th and I'll have time to develop ads that need it and have you proof them.

had. Being this far removed from the cold and snow, my pens are not as weather proof as our friends farther to the north, so wet weather brings several bad things. The first to deal with is 'muddy feet syndrome'. I really don't like to wash hatching eggs. I just do a quick dunk in a disinfectant, or spray as bacteria control. That means a lot of nesting material changes and more frequent egg collection, to get the clean eggs that I like to have for hatching.

We are hoping to make it to the AA National in October and I want to have some nice birds to show, along with a few extras for the silent auction... I hope you are making plans to be there... It would be wonderful to have an opportunity to meet you!

Hope your hatching is going well and that this year's birds are better than last year's!...

Greeting's fellow Ameraucana Alliance members. The new year brings a new hatching season. Hopefully, by now, you have made your final culls and have gotten your breeding pens together. I have been getting a few small tests hatches off, and I am also finding some unwanted results. Which, is the point of test hatches, I suppose. Hopefully, this wacky winter we have been getting in Michigan, temperatures going from -48 windchills to 50-degree actual temperatures in a matter of two days, will stabilize and my real hatching season can begin.

With hatching season upon us, I hope you have given thought to what shows you might be attending. After all, timing your hatches according to the shows you will attend is critical to insure your birds are in peak condition. I have found having them at point of lay is the goal I need to succeed at the shows. Point of lay drastically changes between my large fowl, bantams and even in varieties. Thus, I highly recommend you start keeping track of this, if you haven't started already. You can't expect good conditioning to overcome poor genetics, but you can expect poor conditioning to drastically effect good genetics, which starts with the hatch.

Now that I have that out of the way, this is also a new year for our board of directors. First off, I want to thank you all for electing me to serve as one of your directors again. It truly is an honor to be part of such an amazing alliance of like-minded people. I have also been appointed the director in charge of meets, with Steve Neuman assisting me. So please let me know of any meets you might want placed at the upcoming shows. You can find all the information, including the meet request form, on our Alliance home page under the downloads tab. Remember, you need to place these prior to our newsletter publication preceding the show date, and expect a minimum of three exhibitors of Ameraucana. Hello, Ameraucana Alliance members. I am a lifetime Ameraucana Alliance member, but my first time being a director. I will be in charge of distributing the Champion and Reserve Champion Ameraucana ribbons from our sanctioned meets.

I was born November 1, 1968 in Arcadia, Wisconsin. I grew up on a beef and swine farm and I am the youngest of seven children. As a child, I would ride my bike to the neighbors who had farmyard bantam chickens. I thought those chickens were the coolest things and I wanted to get some of my own, but Dad said, "No." Raising chickens was placed on hold. I attended the University of Wisconsin-Madison for undergraduate work and veterinary school. I graduated from Veterinary School in May of 1993. My wife Patti and I were married in May 1994. We have 3 children. From 1993 to 2003 I worked at Clinton-Darien Veterinary Service in southern Wisconsin. One of my partners was Jeoff Stevens. He raised purebred Large Fowl Black Ameraucanas. It is early February and I have some eggs in the incubator, but nothing hatched yet. When chicks hatch out I will try to learn from past years and not have the chicks crowded too much. I will also keep the waterers cleaned / bleached often. The chicks stay so much healthier when they have some room and clean water. Bacteria and other germs / parasites can multiply quickly in warm water in a brooder, so it is best to be over careful.

Our Coulee Region Poultry Club Show is scheduled for June 1, 2019 in Galesville, Wisconsin. We usually have 800 or more poultry entered. With Mike Gilbert and I, as members, it is always an Ameraucana sanctioned show. Numerous Ameraucana members have showed at the CRPC show over the years, including John Blehm, Bob Walchak, Jim Fegan, Bob Rennolet, and Russ Blair. So, I encourage Ameraucana members to join us in Galesville, Wisconsin on June 1st at a quality spring poultry show, where you can meet with other Ameraucana members and enjoy seeing some beautiful Ameraucana chickens.
