Congratulations to Ameraucana Master Exhibitor Michael K Gilbert! After adding in his wins at our 2019 Ameraucana Eastern National, in Ohio, this past October Mike had earned over 800 Ameraucana Exhibitor Points. Our Exhibitor Points are tallied from meet reports after they are published in our Ameraucana Newsletters, so it takes a while for official tallies and then plaques to be made and mailed before these awards are received. Thanks to Mike's neighbor and fellow Alliance member, Bob Walchak, for making this special presentation.

Our board of directors has agreed to offer over \$3,500 in cash awards to Alliance winners at our Ameraucana Nationals this October. A detailed list is included in this Newsletter. Russ Blair is again offering "Specials" of \$10 each for Best of Variety Bantams in junior competition. Please let me know if you would like to offer any specials and we'll be sure to promote them in the next Newsletter. Specials offered by Alliance members are distributed by them and awards offered by the Alliance will be mailed out after the meets. I can assist winners that prefer trophy/rosette style awards in purchasing them with their cash awards. I've already made hotel reservations in Sedalia, MO for our Ameraucana Southern National, so the plan is to attend both of our nationals this year. I live just 7.5 miles from the

Fowl Fest, in Birch Run, MI so if Alliance members want to park a camper, trailer, RV, etc. in our backyard during our Ameraucana Northern National please email me. We can supply electrical with your extension cord and also offer a barrier-free restroom. I believe free RV parking is also available in the parking lot at the show. More details about both of our national meets are in this Newsletter and on our Ameraucana Forum. Whether you exhibit birds or eggs or not, please try to attend and we'll have a great weekend or two...these are the kind of legendary events you'll want to tell your grandchildren about!

There was a big poultry show in Turkey, in January with about 100 Ameraucanas competing and four varieties represented. Alliance member Mehmet Özgen, is president of the Ameraucana Club of Turkey and has worked to get Ameraucana chickens established in Europe. Our board of directors authorized a plaque be engraved and presented to Mehmet in recognition of all he has done to promote Ameraucanas. The presentation was made by Peter Zuffa, of Slovakia. Peter sits on the EU council that recognized the Ameraucana breed and was at the show to judge the national Ameraucana meet in Turkey. Congratulations to Mehmet and the entire Ameraucana Club of Turkey!

I received an email from my friend Bart Pals, Chairman of the APA Standard Committee, and he said "...I am contacting you to announce the Board of Directors voted to include the Self Blue

Ameraucana into the Standard of Perfection at the APA board meeting in Columbia, Mississippi on January 24th, 2020. If you have any questions or concerns, please let me know. As always, if I can be of any help just let me know..." As the breed club that represents Ameraucana chickens we've added large

fowl "self blue" as an APA recognized variety, but personally I'll continue to breed and show my lavender Ameraucanas, which is the variety that they still mistakenly refer to as self-blue. The lavender variety is the result of the lavender gene, that was identified and termed "lavender" (lav) by poultry scientists back in 1972.

Temple DaSilva and Jeff Vance have ads on our forum's Ameraucana Marketplace offering hatching eggs and/or dayold chicks for sale. The "Ameraucanas" article that I wrote for Backyard

Poultry magazine in 2007 has come up near the top of many internet searches and has been widely quoted. A few years ago, I noticed they made some changes to the text of my article, which was posted on their site, and they stated on the page that their articles are regularly "vetted" and updated. Making changes to my work without my knowledge or permission didn't go over very well and they changed it back. Recently I noticed they made changes without my consent again. This time they agreed to delete my article and also the Ameraucana "Breed of the Month" page I had sponsored. They had their writers replace them with what they believe it should say. Most of it is correct, but they told me "We are going with the APA on this one". This is because the APA's Standard of Perfection still says that since both Ameraucana and Araucana chickens lay eggs with blue shells Ameraucanas "are directly linked with the Araucana stocks brought to the US in the 1930s". This APA claim is also behind Wikipedia's statement that "The Ameraucana was developed...from Araucana chickens brought from Chile". The longer this false breed history is out there and repeated on more sites the longer it will take to reeducate fanciers with the truth. It reminds me of the many decades we dealt with the false claims about blue shelled eggs being "lower in cholesterol and higher in nutritional value".

Our Alliance elections are every two years on even numbered years, so this is it again. Article 6 of our constitution/bylaws covers Election of Officers. "Candidates must notify the President by October 1st of their candidacy." I may not run for office, but I'm not sure yet. We have six Directors and I have no idea at this time how many may run again. Historically with clubs like this it is like pulling teeth (as they say) to get members to run for office, so please consider it. The more the merrier

With the spring newsletter, comes spring chicks! I think this is everyone's favorite time of the year. This is the time we have been looking forward to when we were selecting our breeders in the fall and when we were dealing with frozen waterers in the winter. Chicks make it all worthwhile! With the newly hatched chicks, we get to see the fulfillment of our breeding plans and hopes coming to bear. Hopefully, we get to pick out a few favorites and grow them into better birds than what we had last year. By the time you are reading this, my hatching in South Carolina will be complete for the year and I'll be looking for a place to put all of the grow-outs. I have a tendency to keep way too many, because I'm not very good at

selecting chicks that will grow into what I am looking for, plus I'm always afraid that I'll let the really good one get away!

Here at Tigercreek, I am in the 5th year of working on my blue lacing project. Big thanks to Max Strawn for making the cross to the Andalusian to get the true lacing back in our blues, and to Russell Blair for the help when I came to a standstill, because I had lost my only laced male. I'm beginning to think it's time to stop calling this a 'project' - the type is starting to come together for me. This year, my goal is to produce one pen of blues with double copies of the needed lacing gene with decent type, and another pen with very good type and decent lacing...My plan is to cross the offspring from those two pens to get a few birds with more improvement in type while maintain the good lacing. LOL...the best laid plans, I know, but you do need a plan!

I'm also working on Whites. I used the Whites to improve the type on my blues, and glad I did. It really made a huge improvement in the blues. Another benefit was that I had problems hatching pure Whites, so I bred the blue cross pullets back to the White male and got some very nice White birds. Now to continue hatching enough of them to get consistent color back into the White chicks. By being very selective, I hope to eliminate the yellow chicks and get back to consistently getting the light Greys, that will produce the better colored Whites.
