Greetings all! I hope your spring hatching season is off to a good start. For some members it will just be starting and for others it will be winding down. I will start off with a sincere apology for the delay in the delivery of the Spring 2022 Newsletter. About the time in February when I would have been putting the newsletter together I came down with COVID. Now, about 8 weeks latter I'm just now able to cut through the brain fog and complete lack of energy to get the newsletter pulled together. The initial infection was about like a bad flu in intensity and length. The long-term taste issue, brain fog, and exhaustion/lack of energy has been more "interesting."



I made the decision to not hatch any eggs during this time because I was afraid I wouldn't be able to care for them. I imagine that my first hatch will be in mid to late May or even in the summer.

I hope all members have experienced minimal to no personal issues with the latest avian outbreaks beyond the cancelation of shows.

My winter hatches have matured out nicely and I am happy I made them when I did. Over winter when the bantams were laying for no good reason other than being productive strains I decided to do an improvement cross of a bantam brown red cock to bantam wheaten hens, a bantam buff cock to bantam wheaten hens, and a bantam wheaten cock to bantam light brown hens.

The point of the brown red to wheaten cross was to improve the head color of the brown red hens. The strain I am working with are beautiful in type and productivity, but a female with good head color is a rare bird. The offspring of the cross are not as clean headed as I had hoped, but an improvement over the parents. An expected outcome was loss of solid breast feather color, and I will continue to work on that with the next generation in this subline. I am keeping them separate from the main line and continuing to work the main line female head color at the same time.

For the buff to wheaten cross I was a bit disappointed by the males all coming out with various amounts of black in their tails. Type is nice and the females are fairly good overall. Hopefully, I will be able to get a few chicks on the ground this summer and make a bit more progress if my energy gets better and the brain fog becomes lifts.

Happy March to all my fellow Ameraucana Enthusiasts. I sure am looking forward to Spring, how about you? This winter has not been so brutal as last year despite a couple of "severe" winter storms that passed through. We were lucky here in NW Arkansas, the 12 inches of snow predicted for us turned out to be more like 6-8 inches of snow with some much deeper drifts. It was cold, of course and another front is on the way.

We also had some very pleasant and warm days, so some birds are out on the ground for some sunshine. I must move those birds back under cover today.



I am very excited to get a new structure ready for the Spring hatches. I had a carport delivered recently and plan to enclose the sides with hardware cloth and divide up the space into a few pens. It will be an open-air pen that I can cover with plastic over the winters. I still like them despite the winters here. I find heat here can be as hard on the birds as it is in Florida. I used the 2x3 welded wire in the past but will switch to 1/2" hardware cloth this time to prevent wild birds from accessing the pens.

If you use the Internet or are on any of the Social Networking sites including the Forum, you have probably seen that a highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) is in the US again and has been detected in flocks east of the Mississippi, both commercial and backyard poultry. I want to bring this up, since I know we have members who do not use or have limited access to digital information and in newspapers or TV the issue of Avian Flu may not make it to the headlines in a timely manner. This is a serious topic for commercial growers along with poultry and waterfowl enthusiasts, no matter how big or small. I encourage everyone to look around and take stock of your biosecurity plan. We all have a plan, whether it is casual steps we take to protect our flocks or very strict control of who enters our property and how we isolate our birds from migrating flocks. This is the time to reevaluate what we do to protect our investment in the Birds we enjoy so much.

WHEW, that's said, now onto the fun stuff!

I expect to order new sew on patches soon. They will have the new Logo with the Wheaten cock on a blue background and black border in the 3-inch size. We will put them up on the website when available. The price will be cost + mailing when they are available.

It's looking like a lot of the poultry shows are back so wherever you are, someone will be setting up show coops and opening the doors. Whether you show or not, these are great places to meet other poultry enthusiasts.

This year will be an exciting one for the Ameraucana Alliance as we will be holding 2 National Meets!

On October 1, 2022, the North Central National Meet will be held in Birch Run, MI. The show will be private, open to Ameraucana Alliance Members only. It will be a Lawn Show Style venue and APA & ABA Sanctioned. These are great shows, the judge is not under the usual time crunch and has a chance to spend a lot of time with the exhibitors, answer questions and discuss the birds he has judged.

On October 14-16, 2022, the Western National Meet will be held at the Utah Fancy Poultry Association Fall Show in Ogden, UT. It will be the more traditional APA & ABA sanctioned National held during an all-breed show. It is a double show, the National Meet is show #1 there will also be a Club Meet for show #2.

I will be hatching a "few" chicks and have some adults I would really like to show if I can keep them from molting right when the shows start in the fall. We will see how that goes!

Hopefully between them and the wheaten/buff females and the older buff cock I already had I will be able to hatch out some nice bantam buff this spring. Last fall I was able to pick up a few large fowl New Hampshire and a bantam New Hampshire cockerel. I have an urge to make some red Ameraucana. It should be fun to see how that project turns out.

Mike Gilbert and I are members of the Coulee Region Poultry Club which has its show in Galesville, Wisconsin every June.

Our Coulee Region Poultry Club Show is scheduled for June 4, 2022 here in Galesville, Wisconsin. We usually have 800 or more poultry entered. With Mike Gilbert and I as members it is always an Ameraucana sanctioned show. Numerous Ameraucana members have showed at the CRPC show over the years including John Blehm, Bob Walchak, Jim Fegan, Bob Rennolet, and Russ Blair.
