President – Russell Blair

Greetings everyone, as I write I find myself collecting eggs for the setter in hopes of hatching some fall champions. I would also like to discuss our 2023 National meet that was hosted by the Tennessee Valley Poultry Club at their annual Dixie Classic show in Knoxville, Tennessee the weekend of December 2&3. Although the postal service caused a few hiccups with a couple entries Harry House and the entire TVPC team were very hospitable and understanding. Although it was impossible to have all of our Ameraucana lined up in order and in the same rows they did all get cooped in and for that I want to give them a big Thank You.

They were also very gracious in the amount of room and tables that they provided for our annual silent auction. We had 4 dozen bantam hatching eggs, 6 pairs (consisting of Black, Blue, Lavender/Self Blue, and even 2 ermines with a black breeding pair) a trio of brown reds, and a quad of whites all up for grabs in the bantam class which were graciously donated by Michael Muenks, Max Strawn, John Blehm and myself. In the large fowl class, we had 2 trios of spectacular Blues and a fabulous trio of splash graciously donated by Stan Alder, Max Strawn and Stacy Melton respectfully. Not only did we have this

wonderful display of Ameraucana, which drew a lot of people to our club table, Jim Laatsch (who is not even a member) donated a 3-hole bantam carrier he made and we also had an anonymous donation of a 150th APA commemorative Standard of Perfection donated that we sold raffle tickets for. Which I am proud to announce raised a total of \$1,163 of revenue for our Alliance. Thank you to all the members and nonmembers who graciously donated items or livestock to make this such a great success. Also let me give a special thank you to Stan Alder for volunteering to head this up, along with the many others who also helped answer questions and set this all up making it a huge success.

I was a little surprised we only had 5 entries of eggs, should have been 6 but I misplaced my entry somewhere in the show hall, but the quality of the entries was phenomenal. It really made Janie's, who graciously volunteered to judge them, job extremely difficult. In the end Stacy Melton was awarded Best and Reserve in the large fowl class with her pullet and hen entry, in respective order. Michael Muenks and Robert Rennolet took the Best and Reserve respectfully in the bantam class both with pullet entries.



We had a great turn out in the open show with 138 Bantam entries by 13 exhibitors and 69 large fowl entries by 14 exhibitors. We had 6 displays of bantam (2-blue, 1-black, 2-wheaten, and 1-white) and 1 display of large fowl black by 4 different exhibitors. Our bantam class was judged by Rick Hare and the large fowl were judged by Brian Knox, with both of them choosing our champion overall and res champion overall Ameraucana champions. In the Bantam Class a nonmember took Best of Breed with a black cockerel out of 30 entries from 7 exhibitors, with Rebecca Howie respectfully taking Reserve of Breed with her Blue Wheaten Hen out of 21 entries from 6 different exhibitors. In the large fowl class Best of Breed went to myself, Russ Blair, with my Splash Hen out of 7 entries from 4 exhibitors (which went on to reserve AOSB) and Reserve of Breed respectfully went to Max Strawn with his Blue Pullet out of 22 entries from 4 exhibitors. The overall Champion Ameraucana award went to the nonmember Black Bantam cockerel with my large fowl Splash hen taking the Reserve Overall Champion Ameraucana award. Champion display was awarded to myself, Russ Blair, with my

bantam blue display with Michael Muenks Black Bantam display respectfully taking the reserve champion display award. Jerry DeSmidt was awarded the Champion Bantam Trio award with his whites and Michael Muenks took home the Res Bantam Trio award with his Blacks. We only had one large fowl trio entry, so Jerry DeSmidt respectfully was awarded the champion large fowl trio, which went on to win Champion Large Fowl Trio of the Show.

In the junior show we had 4 Bantam entries from 1 exhibitor, judged by Jeff Halbach, and in the large fowl class we had 7 entries from 2 different exhibitors judged by Jacob Bates. Gavin Bailey took the Best of Breed award with his Blue Wheaten Pullet out of 2 entries and again took the Reserve of Breed award with his Wheaten Pullet out of 2 entries in the Bantam class. In the Large Fowl Class new member Turner Holland respectfully won the Best of Breed award (which went on to win Ch AOSB in the junior division) with his Black cockerel out of 4 entries from 2 exhibitors, with Brandi Hills respectfully taking the Reserve of Breed award (Which went on to win Res AOSB in the junior division). Congratulations to these fine young men and women, they truly are an asset to our poultry hobby and I look forward to seeing them for years to come. Not only did we have a great showing of Ameraucana we also had a great turn out of Ameraucana Alliance members. With several members like Johnny Parks and his wife, Barb Campbell and her husband, Jeff and Sherry

Vance, and Don Cash all showing up just for the fellowshipping and comradery. After the show on Saturday a bunch of us went to Shoney's to eat and conduct our annual meeting. There were 18 Ameraucana Alliance members in attendance, with their spouses/families, at this year's annual meeting. There we discussed old business, like Becky Pelton and the many others' efforts with the Ermine Ameraucana, and new business like our Facebook presence and how we can improve it and make it friendlier moving forward, along with splash and self-blue bantam recognition.

All in all, I think our National Meet kept the long-standing tradition of being a truly epic event alive and well. I believe everyone had a blast sitting around the club table and enjoying one another's company while sharing jokes, breeding practices, and fundamental good husbandry concerning our poultry hobby as a whole. Before I go, I just want to remind you that with this new year it is also an election year



for all our elected positions. So, we will be needing volunteers with the interest to participate in club affairs for the upcoming elections next fall. If any of our dues paying members are interested, please go to our website at Ameraucana.org to see all the requirements, expectations and such that is written in our By-Laws. While you are there feel free to go to our forum as well for a full report of the results of our 2023 National Meet along with some pictures.

Speaking about the forum, some of you may have noticed the announcement I made in the members only section pertaining to the former Ameraucana Alliance Open Group on Facebook. Due to no policy or by laws dictating how we govern that group, hold administrators accountable if/when members file complaints. I decided to cut all ties to it to

protect our members, directors and most of all our Alliance from any backlash from disciplinary actions administrators take upon the members of that group. The Facebook group is still operating, with dues paying members agreeing to help administrate it, under the new name "The unofficial Ameraucana Alliance" Facebook group. I truly think this will protect not only the current board of directors but also future board of directors from the turmoil that the Facebook platform causes.

Before I go there is also one more thing I would like to discuss. It appears we are getting low on our 2018 Handbooks. This means we will be needing to publish a new one in the upcoming months. In years past we have offered ads to our members and vendors, for a fee, to help cover the cost. We will be looking to print 500 handbooks which is rather costly, so please check in to our forum for updates and ad opportunities. 
Meet Reports

Hello again from Eastern Washington!

We have a few Washington club meets coming up this spring. The first one will be the Cascade Spring (double) Show put on by Emmett Wild on March 16th, in Monroe. The next one is the CRPE Spring Invitational in Stevenson on April 20th. I plan to attend both and would love to see you and your Ameraucanas!

Besides watching and evaluating my grow outs in preparation for these shows and my upcoming breeding season, I have been anxiously awaiting spring. I have big plans for my 2,500 sq ft garden expansion, most specifically the many more dahlias I'll be able to grow!

Back to birds. Lately, I've been seeing several folks ask questions about their Ameraucana laying white or tan eggs, so I thought it may be helpful to share my reasons for choosing to have my flock's DNA tested for the blue egg gene through

IQ Bird Genetics in Florida and to share a little bit about the process.

While I am primarily breeding towards the SOP, egg color is also important to me. I don't want a white or tan egg layer to pop up in my Ameraucana flock years down the road. I know some of you may have even heard stories about Ameraucana laying white, tan, olive, or even brown eggs in their show cages at sanctioned shows. These birds look the part as show quality Ameraucana (phenotypically) but lay the wrong egg color. It's disappointing, right?

My line had been outcrossed to a non-blue egg laying breed many generations before I got my starter birds. However, they had never been tested to ensure they are homozygous for the blue egg gene. Like many, I had just made the assumption.

Well, assumptions are not in line with my personal goals for my flock. Testing my breeding stock has been less expensive in the long run than test-breeding each bird and growing out enough of their offspring until point of lay to statistically rule out any possibility of blue egg gene heterozygosity.

Here are some fun facts about blue egg color-

A bird will lay eggs with blue shells whether or not she has one or two copies of the blue egg mutation. This blue pigment goes all the way through the shell and is visible inside the egg as well. You may need to peel back the inner membranes to see the blue inside. Sometimes the shade of blue is very pale.



Blue shells are dominant to white shells. Hatching only from blue eggs is not enough to ensure your flock will always lay blue eggs. Be aware that it only takes pairing two heterozygous birds to produce offspring that do not inherit the blue egg gene at all. About 25% of them, give or take. Another half will only be heterozygous like their parents, and although they will lay blue shelled eggs, they will not pass the trait on to all of their offspring either! Can you see how this can become problematic?

I decided not to take any chances with my flock. I wanted to be 100% sure of what genetics my birds have and will pass on. It is important for both my Standard-bred Ameraucanas and also for the olive egger crosses I make with them. I have now tested all of my breeding birds and it has given me a peace of mind that was worth the cost, in my opinion.

IQ Bird Genetics in Florida will test a chicken's DNA for their blue egg gene status. You can send in feathers or a blood sample. I opted for feathers, but it's just as easy to clip a toenail a bit short and collect a few drops of blood from your bird onto their paper forms. The cost per bird is \$20-\$25. Once they receive samples, they email your results in as little as a couple of days. It's very quick and easy.

I feel this testing opportunity is important for those working on project varieties, especially those that have been outcrossed to another breed.

If you have any questions about egg color inheritance or breeding for colored eggs, I'm always available to talk chickens and genetics.

I hope you have a great season!
