They have served multiple terms and chose not to run for re-election as directors on this year's ballot. I truly wish them all the best in whatever they pursue and would like to say thank you, on behalf of myself and our membership, for the countless hours you all have sacrificed to perform the director duties you were tasked with. I am also honored to announce that our

We had a huge club area for our Silent Auction and Egg Show with plenty of seating area for our members to congregate and

We had a number of fine donations which garnered plenty of attention. Stacy Melton's stunning black LF trio sold for a handsome price and now live in California with Jorge Gutierrez, who flew in to attend the show and drive back home with a number of fine birds. Andi and Stacy manned the table, and we also added some new members to the roster.

Michael Muenks made sure we had all the odds and ends needed at the table and was ready to jump in whenever needed including taking care of the Display points when the judging was completed. Jessica Loree brought a huge string of birds and was still there to assist when needed.



We had a great turnout from far and wide. Max Strawn came up from Texas, Bruno Menarim, and new member Colton Thacker from Kentucky, Stan Alder and Becky Pelton from South Carolina, and Stacy Melton from Virginia made the long drive to join us and exhibit their fine Ameraucanas. Bruno and Colton took most of the pictures posted on the Forum and FB page.

Congratulations to Brad Stonebarger on the big wins with his outstanding Black Ameraucanas, both LF and bantam.

Many of you know I am very enthralled with the Ermine variety. Becky Pelton has been working with LF Ermines for almost 2 decades and after pestering her endlessly, she took a small Ermine male over black bantams to start a 1st generation bantam Ermine. She shared them with me and a few others and now we have a group of people seriously working toward bantam sized Ermines. Our National can boast that there was a class of 15 (4 exhibitors) LF and 24 (5 exhibitors) bantams. It was a real pleasure to chat with Michael Muenks, Becky Pelton and Stan Alder about our experiences with Ermines.

They showed great progress and consistency. Our bantam females are within the window of bantam size, the males are still running a bit big overall, with a few exceptions. Michael Muenks had a nicely patterned cockerel that met the standard size, my own fellows are still "chunky monkey" size, but I have a couple youngsters that might mature over the next couple of months tiny enough to be true bantam size. Like any parti-colored bird, we have some challenges to overcome, but with such a dedicated group of breeders, I see this variety being accepted and having lasting appeal over the years.

My next big show will be in Shawnee, OK. It will be an APA National Show and the last Qualifying Meet for the Self Blue bantams. I have 3 cockerels and 2 pullets getting ready to strut their stuff and enter the realm of an accepted variety of Ameraucanas by the APA, having been accepted by the ABA several years ago. It has been a long road to acceptance for the original Self Blue team. I listed most of them in my last newsletter and am excited to play a small part in this last step of their efforts as dedicated breeders of Self Blue.

This was election year, and I would like to congratulate Russ Blair as the continuing President of the Ameraucana

Alliance, though I was offered a position as a director again, I am choosing to spend the next couple of years on my flock at home and with my grandson. He has moved to Kentucky, and I will be visiting him there or bringing him back to Arkansas for as much quality time as possible before he gets to the age where MawMaw is not so cool or as much fun as his friends. The years fly by so fast, and every moment is so precious.

I am a Lifetime Member of the Ameraucana Alliance and in the future will continue to serve when I can to promote this wonderful breed of poultry that brings me so much happiness.

Greetings from the Ameraucana Alliance! As I draft this report in late November, the two 2024 national celebrations of Ameraucana by the members of the Ameraucana Alliance are fond memories. I was fortunate to be able to attend both national celebrations this year. I wish to thank all the members who assisted in the planning and execution of both events along with all the members who made the trip to Portage, WI and or Fayetteville, AR to participate.

Celebrating Ameraucana in Dairyland

Celebrating Ameraucana in Dairyland was hosted by the Wisconsin International Poultry Club at their show in Portage, Wisconsin the weekend of

September 28-29, 2024. Ameraucana converged on Portage, Wisconsin from as far west as Kansas and South Dakota and as far east as Michigan. Many club members located in the upper Midwest took advantage of the show being close to home. The sunny and warm weekend felt more like summer and many veteran exhibitors at the show reminisced of past Wisconsin International Poultry Shows where snowflakes made an appearance in contrast to the shorts and t-shirt weather of 2024.

The Wisconsin International Poultry Show had its largest show to date. In the open show for our national celebration of Ameraucana, 170 bantam and 78 large fowl Ameraucana were exhibited and in the junior show 48 bantam and 29 large fowl Ameraucana were exhibited. A total of 325 Ameraucana in exhibition made the event a true Celebration of Ameraucana in Dairyland and in the region of the United States where the breed

came into its own and what I believe may be the largest national meet for the Ameraucana Alliance thus far.

Taking top honors as Champion Ameraucana was Rachel Dunn with a black bantam hen. Rachel's black bantam hen went on to take Champion AOCCL, Champion Bantam of Show, and Reserve Champion Land Fowl of Show. Quite the bird and quite the feat at a show with over 3,500 poultry in exhibition. The Reserve of Breed was a fine wheaten pullet exhibited by Mike Gilbert.



Taking the Reserve Champion Ameraucana was a beautiful black large fowl pullet by Kyle Porosky. Kyle's pullet went on to take Champion AOSB. Kyle also took Reserve of Breed and Reserve Champion AOSB with his handsome black cockerel.

Other notable awards included a sweep of the Ameraucana Champion and Reserve Champion Trios in both the bantam class and the large fowl class by Jerry DeSmidt with his white bantam and large fowl Ameraucana. The Champion Ameraucana Display was black large fowl by Daniel Cook and the Reserve Champion Ameraucana Display was white bantams by Jerry DeSmidt.

A long-standing tradition has been the egg contest at national meets. This year's contest had 19 entries between the bantam and large fowl eggs. Sweeping the bantam class was John Blehm who earned the Champion and Reserve Champion awards for his bantam pullet eggs. The Champion large fowl eggs award was taken by Daniel Cook with his hen eggs and the Reserve Champion large fowl eggs award being earned by Robert Rennolet for his pullet eggs.

I would like to thank all those who helped with the planning and execution of Celebrating Ameraucana in Dairyland. I would like to thank Ann Dunn and Rachel Dunn for planning the social side of the weekend and organizing the egg show. I would also like to thank our egg show judges Rowley Dunn, John Dunn, Tracy Wright, and Molli Babler who were an effective team. I would like to thank Laurie Ashley and Ben Eddy for their work on donations for the silent auction. I would like to thank all the numerous businesses and individuals who donated items along with Robert Rennolet, Mike Gilbert, Russ Blair, and Ann Dunn for their donation of birds for the silent auction. In addition, I would like to thank Rachel Dunn, Ann Dunn, Mike Gilbert, Robert Rennolet, Russ Blair, Jeff Sonsalla, David Blair, and Jessica Loree for their help with decorating the club table, the silent auction, staffing the club table, display point calculation, pictures, and completing the meet report. If I have inadvertently left off anyone, I apologize and do know you have my gratitude. Many hands made light work. Thank you also to the Wisconsin International Poultry Club for being our host and a wonderful partner.

Meet Requests

Thank you to everyone who sent in meet requests. The earlier meet requests are made, the better the chance of getting the club information into the show catalog to advertise the club's meet. Please only send one meet request per email. Many clubs need the meets over six months in advance if one hopes to get the club logo and information into the show catalog. Remember that our club meet policy requires that the meets be placed so that they may be published in the newsletter before the entry close date of the meet. It is not too early to request club meets at your favorite spring and summer 2025 show.

Report from Bantam Hill

I am quite happy with the progress that was personally made here at Bantam Hill on the bantam Ermine project. There are a few pullets that are spot-on bantam weight, and the cockerels are close. There was such a nice group of "bantam" Ermine at Fayetteville that I hope there is enough interest in Ermine bantams for them to follow close on the heels of the large fowl Ermine toward American Poultry Association approval. I hope to be in good enough health to make it to the 2nd pre-qualifying meet at the Moon City Poultry Show March 29-30, 2025 in Wapakoneta, OH with both a few large fowl Ermine and a few bantam Ermine. A wintertime tip to help the birds on cold nights below freezing is to give them a bit of cracked corn or scratch grain an hour or two before roosting. A small bit of grain will keep their gizzards busy through the night and generate some warmth without messing up their normal daily ration of food intake. Which leads me to my closing.

As always, I close with my reminder to not forget to feed grit. Grit is a chicken's teeth. I am always amazed at how much they consume.
